Two new circular flower beds are to be installed for the Parish Council this summer. They will flank the existing bed on the grass verge at Blind Lane, on the approach to the A1 Motorway. Once installed for the Parish Council, they will be maintained by Durham County Council, and offer a colourful improvement to the vista on this important link road.

Parish gardener Frank Leighton works throughout the Parish area, often accompanied by his introductory display board, and is happy to talk about his current work on site.

We would like to thank Frank for his efforts, and commitment to maintaining good standards of horticulture presentation.

Planning

The Avant development of the former BOC site continues. We welcome the new residents to the North Lodge parish. Development of the former Arizona Chemical site will follow in due course.

Regarding the County Durham Plan, a pre submission draft is being prepared following a public consultation which concluded on 8th March. This will be submitted to an independent examiner, along with all comments received and the examiner will decide whether the scheme will go ahead. It does not include any development within the parish. We will continue to be vigilant and proactive in responding to any planning proposals which will affect the residents of North Lodge Parish.



Keeping Up To Date on Parliamentary News and Standards

Councillor Dennis Hall updated Councillors throughout the year on Parliamentary news, new regulations and standards. A new report from the Committee on Standards in Public Life was considered during the year. A key focus has been upon seeking to achieve closer liaison with the County Council to improve the handling of queries and issues that arise within the Parish. Councillor Hall's brief will be to continue to keep the Council advised and compliant in such matters as data protection, Standards and the Code of Conduct.

Postman Brian Milner

The Parish Council would like to send congratulations to our own North Lodge postman, Brian Milner BEM. He was awarded the National Postman of the Year award in October 2018. A real achievement, well done.

North Lodge Parish Notice Boards

The Parish Council has embarked on renewing all the notice boards throughout the parish. There will also be two additional boards, one in Vigo Lane and the other one alongside the Northlands bus shelter. All the boards will be larger and contain a lot more community information.




NORTH LODGE PARISH STONE **BUS SHELTERS**

...and show consideration by ensuring that your hedges, shrubs and trees do not extend at

all beyond your property's boundary with public footways, throughout the whole year.

Giving clear headroom of about 7 feet 6 inches is also important. This should allow for the safe passage of pedestrians, eliminating the risk of facial injury or damage to clothing, prams and umbrellas from thorns and branches [and possible legal action]. Problems of this sort which affect any individual pedestrian can be most effectively and efficiently dealt with by reporting them directly to Durham County Council which has enforcing powers under the Highways Act 1980.



PAVEMENT AND ROAD PROBLEMS

Holes or ridges of at least 2 centimetres drop or rise on pavements and dangerous potholes in the road can be reported as safety issues to Durham County Council.

Reporting problems to Durham County Council Problems regarding hedges, pavements and roads may be reported directly to the Council by telephone [03000 26 0000], by text messaging [0779 787 0192], starting with the word: INFO, or through its "Do it online" system, for which see the Durham County Council website. Using the number on the nearest street lamp standard as a position marker may be helpful.

Roads have been re-surfaced by the County Council at Lombard Drive (East), Leander Avenue, Merlin Drive and Hampton Court.

Highways England work affecting the Picktree Lodge Estate entrance - It is expected that the A1 motorway bridge renovation work will start up again this year.



Dog Owners/Walkers & Public Spaces

A Public Space Protection Order [PSPO] for dog control was implemented on 1st June 2017, by Durham County Council. This is of potential interest for everyone. Please see the DCC website for extensive important details.

PAVEMENTS AND CAR PARKING

There is usually no justification or need for parking partly on pavements where there are houses on only one side of a road. Otherwise, if you do decide to park partly on a pavement, please give essential consideration to pedestrians (for whom the pavements were solely built), including wheelchair users and those pushing prams, and ensure that this fully allows for their safe passage. A maximum obstruction of no more than one third of the pavement may keep you free from objections which police can be asked to enforce. Please also avoid the potentially dangerous and annoying blocking of any public pavement through your use of it as a private driveway parking extension to your property.





Merlin Drive and Low Flatts Play Areas



Our play areas continue to be well used and appreciated.

The nuisance of molehills continues at Merlin Drive, but are fortunately flattened by the grass cutting equipment in the summer.

We await delivery of a new covered waste bin at Low Flatts to help prevent the spread of rubbish by birds etc. We once again ask that dog owners put dog waste bags in the bins provided and not dumped around the area causing a health hazard.

The play equipment is inspected weekly, but we ask if the public would inform the police if they witness any antisocial behaviour.

We anticipate that the housing development on Vigo Lane will contain provision for some play facility. North Lodge Parish Council, together with our County Councillor Craig Martin will continue to source ways of enhancing this provision within the parish.



Parish Environment Caretaker

The litter picking by our environment caretaker, Frank Leighton, has again proved to be a resounding success. The Parish Council would like to thank Frank for his diligence in keeping the Parish clean and tidy, and in spotting any issues of fly tipping, or vandalism, which need addressing.

Crime and Community Safety

North Lodge Parish continues to experience a low crime rate in comparison to other areas of Co Durham. There is, however, a slight rise in vehicle crime. Residents are reminded not to leave valuables and cash on show in vehicles and to fully secure them when unattended.

Sadly, there was a fatal road traffic accident on Drum Industrial Estate. Police, Business and County Council representatives along with the North Lodge County Councillor have held a meeting to discuss parking in that area. The Parish Council sends condolences to the family and friends of the victim.

Police initiatives for County Durham have included measures to reduce speeding and knife crime. Speed monitoring vehicles and traffic personnel have been deployed within the parish. A knife amnesty was implemented, which finished in March.

A police operation to remind residents to make sure their residential property was secure in the winter nights was also undertaken.

Key crime prevention messages for residents

- a) In the dark winter nights, consider using lamp timers to give the illusion the property is occupied when you are away from it.
- b) In the summer months, remember to close windows, lock garden sheds and secure gardening equipment.

Chester-le-Street Area Action Partnership money was used to purchase two e-bikes for local police officers to use in the area including North Lodge.

Once again congratulations are sent to Durham Police. The service has been identified by the HMIC Inspectorate as outstanding. The Parish Council also sends good wishes for a happy retirement to the Chief Constable, Mr Mike Barton.
